

Water and Life

In 2004, Pope John Paul II wrote, "As a gift from God, water is a vital element essential to survival, thus everyone has a right to it." Water is intrinsically linked to the right to life, to food and to health. Access to safe water is a basic human right. Yet. . .

- One billion people throughout the world lack access to safe water.
- 1.8 million people die each year from water-related diseases.
- The average person living in North America or Japan uses 350 liters of water a day.
- People in Europe use 200 a day.
- People in sub-Saharan Africa use 10-20 a day.
- To ensure our basic needs, we all need 20 to 50 liters of water per day (UNESCO).

What can you do to conserve water?



Living Water

"Jacob's well was there. Jesus, tired from his journey, sat down there at the well It was about noon. A woman of Samaria came to draw water. Jesus said to her, 'Give me a drink.' His disciples had gone



into the town to buy food. The Samaritan woman said to him, 'How can you, a Jew, ask me, a Samaritan woman, for a drink?' (For Jews use nothing in common with Samaritans.) Jesus answered and said to her, 'If you knew the gift of God and who is saying to you, "Give me a drink," you would have asked him and he would have given you <u>living water</u>.' (The woman) said to him, 'Sir, you do not even have a bucket and the cistern is deep; where then can you get this <u>living water</u>? Are you greater than our father Jacob, who gave us this cistern and drank from it himself with his children and his flocks?' Jesus answered and said to her, 'Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again; but whoever drinks the water I shall give will never thirst; the water I shall give will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life" (John 4:6-14).

<u>Living Water Reflection:</u> In the ancient middle east—flowing water was the difference between Life & Death. Water is necessary to live, and wells were hard to find and storing water difficult.


Jesus was telling the woman that he was able to provide what is needed for true life, that is for eternal life.
