On December 16, 2010, Most Reverend John Noonan was installed 5th bishop of the Diocese of Orlando. Since that time, Bishop Noonan has traveled from parish to parish and school to school, visiting with the many beautiful and holy people that comprise the Body of Christ in Central Florida.
