Deacon Annual Documents are Due June 1st

For a year now, we have been preparing the Order of Deacons to fully meet their annual requirements. Thank you to the all deacon and pastors who have already submitted their documents. Below is a list of documents that are due by June 1st.

Basic Requirements:

- 1. Statement of Mutual Expectations & Pastor Assessment,
- 2. Continuing Formation Form, &
- 3. Your Funeral Arrangements, if not on file with the Office of the Permanent Diaconate.

All 'Active', 'Retired' & 'Senior' deacons, currently with faculties are required to submit these documents annually to remain a deacon in 'good standing'. Seasonal deacon need to work with their home diocese to retain their faculties.

All the forms are on the Deacon Webpage in English & Spanish.

NOTE: Those completing the forms in Spanish must have them translated to English prior to submitting to the Office of the Permanent Diaconate.

Tip to Maintaining Your Annual Continuing Formation Form (CFF)

The chief complaint about completing the annual CFF is that so many can't remember what they did over the last year, therefore they struggle to figure out how to get to 30 hours of continuing formation.

Here's what I do to keep myself organized. I set an appointment on my calendar for the first of every month. This reminder is to get me to take care of the regular maintenance tasks in my life (i.e. check the A/C filters, medicate the cat, pay the bills, and update my Continuing Formation Form). Then on or about May 15th of each year I email it, with my Statement of Mutual Expectations & Assessment form to the pastor and set an appointment to discuss. It is a personal discipline that has helped me turn in these forms, on time, each year that I've been a deacon.

LITURGICAL CORNER

<u>EMHC Mandate Renewals</u>. The following link: <u>EMHC Mandates</u>, outlines the requirements for "New" and "Renewal" of mandates and related paperwork.

- As deacons we can be presenters for the recommended annual Days of Eucharistic Reflections to facilitate mandate renewals.
- For NEW EMHC's the training curriculum and trainers are managed by the diocese office of Liturgy and Music. If you are interested in being a certified trainer for these sessions you must be vetted and approved by the Office of Liturgy and Music.

An issue surfacing for some EMHC around the diocese are that their mandate expired. Mandates are good for 5 years. If the EMHC's mandate expires, they must take the diocesan workshop.

Renewals can be quite simple. The parish hosts scheduled annual days of reflection on the Eucharist, completes the forms, the pastor approves the renewal, and the complete renewal form is sent to the Office of Liturgy and Music.

<u>Liturgical Movements</u>. Our liturgical presence, movement, and gestures mean a lot to the Liturgy.

- Our presence is one of a non-anxious invitation to prayer. Knowing the liturgy and being fully engaged keeps us in rhythm and sync with the celebrant and celebration.
- Our movements are to be done smoothly, deliberate and in harmony with the celebrant and other assisting lay ministers. Our movements must convey confidence and pastoral leadership. Should an error occur, how we respond makes a difference in the dignity of the celebration and the minister.
- Our gestures really are very limited. Hands are to be in a good prayer position unless we are carrying the book of the Gospels, preparing the altar, during the elevation of the cup and distributing the precious blood. None of our gestures are to:
 - Mimic the gestures reserved for the presider (i.e. orans position at the Our Father).
 - Elevating the Body of Christ/Chalice during distribution of communion.
 - o Be theatrical in an effort to be more reverent or inviting.





OUTSIDE OF THE WALLS



Catholic Charities continues to finalize the strategic Disaster Services plan, including the establishment of an Emergency Operations Center (EOC) for the Diocese of Orlando that will go active in advance of a predicted hurricane for our area or in response to a tragedy requiring support. The EOC will be manned at Catholic Charities of Central

Florida and will also include a virtual EOC involving representatives of parishes

identified as potential food/water distribution points following an event. Longer term planning will include information on storm sheltering, cold weather sheltering and emergency response teams. A training for all parishes agreeing to stage for emergency food and water distribution will take place at St. James Cathedral on June 1, followed by a 12:10 Mass to Avert Storms at St. James Cathedral. All are invited!





Catholic Charities is able to provide "Mental Health First Aid" Training to interested parishes/communities. This is a nationally recognized, evidence-based program aimed at helping us to better understand adults who may be experiencing mental health concerns,

training us on how to respond to them with compassion and sensitivity and increasing awareness of the many facets of mental illness. Many of our parishes engage in outreach ministries to the homeless and the poor and mental health concerns are often evident. This class better equips us to respond with love and compassion. Classes can accommodate up to 30 individuals. The training takes 8 hours and can be done in one day or in two four hour sessions. We will soon be offering this training to individuals working with children and youth as well. There is a group fee, paid by the parish or community organization, of \$250 and a per person fee of \$20 for books and materials. The second Agape Mission Market opens officially on May 14 at Holy Spirit Catholic Church in Lake Wales in Polk County. The concept of a mission market is a choice food pantry where clients have the ability to select fresh fruits and vegetables, bakery goods and dairy proteins to augment the non-perishable food items they receive as well. The Agape Mission Market in Orlando, operating on the main campus of Catholic Charities of Central Florida, serves about 300 families per week and distributes nearly 900,000 pounds of food annually. The Agape Mission Market at Holy Spirit is a harmonized ministry of Holy Spirit and Catholic Charities of Central Florida and is the first of several

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new Agape Mission Markets envisioned in the coming months and years. Volunteers are critical to the operations of these food ministries. - Deacon for at least three (3) years (Exceptions made on a case-by-case basis),
- Serving ministry in and outside the walls of the Church, and



- Willing to fulfill all the requirements of the Deacon Mentor Program.
 - Meeting Mentee at least once a month,
 - Meeting the Mentee and Wife at least quarterly,
 - Prepare and submit the monthly mentor report, and
 - Prepare and submit the annual recommendation for continued formation & ordination.
