GENERAL ANNOUNCEMENT

DIOCESAN POLICY ACKNOWLEDGEMENT: Recently the Diaconate office sent out a set of policies with the requirement for each deacon to sign and return the original Acknowledgement page to the Diaconate office. As is often the case, it took a sensitive incident that fell outside the policy norms to bring to light that all deacons with faculties in the Diocese of Orlando need to be made aware of policies designed to ensure the safe environment and defined boundaries for the sake of the clergy, diocesan staff, volunteer ministry leaders and all the people of God, especially the most vulnerable of the worshipping community of faith.

This policy acknowledgement should have always been a part of the deacon's annual requirements and at the Bishop's direction it has now become a requirement. Regular review of diocesan policy and procedures by clergy are important because they form the basis of how we are allowed to interface with the vulnerable population that we serve.

We have had a few deacons or men in formation who have pushed back on the need to sign this certification. Recognize that these policies were developed by the Diocese Policy Review Board - if there are concerns with the policies you must identify the specific issues you feel exist through the Diaconate Office. The Diaconate office will coordinate with the Human Resources office who will address any concerns. This is the proper way to voice concerns or to challenge policy. There is room for common sense application of these policies but no room for disregarding policies we may disagree with.

On the day of your ordination you were asked by your bishop, "Do you promise respect and obedience to me and my successors?" Our response: "I do." (Rites of Ordination, Ordination of Deacons, 201)

The policy acknowledgement form you have been asked to sign highlights diocesan policies that have been enforce for many years. Some may not have been aware of them or fully complied with them, but none the less they exist and we are required to comply.





Flat out refusal to comply with this review and acknowledgment will result in loss of faculties or dismissal in the case of those in diaconate formation.

Annual Deacon Assessments

84% of the Assessments have been collected to date.

6% of the invoiced parishes noted their deacons were no longer active in the life of the parish.

Annual Survey

The survey was closed on August 24th. The response rate for the survey was 69%. While this is statistically sound to gaining an understanding of the health of the Order of Deacons in the Diocese of Orlando. We were not able to update the records of 31% of the deacons serving in the diocese.

We are in the process of analyzing the data received to draft a report for the Bishop. Once complete the results will be made public.

Deacon Annual Documents

Thank you to those of you who have complied with the Diocesan policy to submit the annually required documents.

Question of the Month

A deacons posted the following question in the Deacon Survey:

"I would like someone to explain to me, why if we are Ordained clergy, why does the deacon need to ask the priest for a blessing before proclaiming the Gospel? I would like the pastoral and the Theological explanation of it."

RESPONSE: Among the duties proper to the deacon is the proclamation of the Gospel (See General Instruction of the Roman Missal, nos. 175 and 212; Introduction to the Lectionary for Mass, no. 50; see Ceremonial of Bishops, no. 24). In the absence of a deacon, a priest may proclaim the Gospel (See General Instruction of the Roman Missal, no. 212, Introduction to the Lectionary for Mass, no. 49).

Don't we all want God's blessing? Let's reframe the question just a little bit, "Why does the Deacon ask the **Presider** for a blessing before proclaiming **God's Word**?"

First we must understand the roles we fulfill during the Mass.

The Vatican published a Motu Proprio from Pope Benedict called "Omnium in Mentem" and dated October 26, 2009. Writing in an explanatory note for the Motu Proprio, Archbishop Francesco Coccopalmerio, president of the Pontifical Council for Legislative Texts, commented on the modified canons (1008, 1009, 1086, 1117 and 1124). These variations, he said, "concern two separate questions: adapting the text of the canons that define the ministerial function of deacons … and suppressing a subordinate clause in three canons concerning marriage, which experience has shown to be inappropriate."

The first issue addressed by the Motu Propio is the role of the diaconate.

Part of the current canon describes sacred orders as participating in the headship of Christ. The Motu Proprio clarifies that priests and bishops participate in the headship of Christ 'in persona Christi,' whereas deacons serve the Church, the people of God, through the ministry, services, or 'diakonia' of liturgy, word, and charity. Thus, the document emphasizes there is a "clear distinction between the diaconate and the presbyterate. The distinction is between the deacon who acts "in imago Dei" and the priest who acts 'in persona Christi. (Full Text of Article)

Therefore, we seek God's blessing from the presider, who stands 'in persona Christi' to seek God's blessing so that our proclamation of His Word is done in truth, that we totally empty ourselves making room for the Holy Spirit who acts through us so that God may enter into an intimate dialog between Himself and his children present.

Why wouldn't the deacon want the blessing of God who has taught us from our youth; to proclaim His wondrous deeds, so that He would strengthen us through the Holy Spirit that we may proclaim His mighty Word to all generations yet to come, with His power and justice, to the highest heaven? (Ps 71:17-19)
