It is not too late to join the 40 members of our community (deacons, men in formation, and wives), attending the special sessions focused on our diaconal ministry at the Orlando Liturgical Conference being held August 22nd - 24th.

Bishop Shawn McKnight, Bishop of Jefferson City, MO, will be a keynote. He is a renowned authority on the Permanent Diaconate, and will be offering talks on Thursday, August 22nd, specifically directed at our important role in the Church, today.

The Deacon's Ministry of Charity as a Service of Communion. The twin crises of clergy sexual abuse and the abuse of power have strained the bond of communion between the clergy and their people. In this talk, Bishop McKnight will highlight the unique position of the permanent deacon to facilitate and repair a broken relationship between the shepherd and his flock.

The Deacon's Liturgical Ministry as an Epiphany of Service. Have you ever wondered why a deacon has some roles and not others in the liturgy? This talk will highlight some of the theological, social and ritual sources for the deacon's ministry in the liturgy, which serves to underscore the nature of the deacon's ministry beyond the liturgy.

The one-day cost for the conference on Thursday is \$90, and you may apply for reimbursement for your conference expense as part of your \$100 annual continuing education fund from the Office of Permanent Deacons. Full conference fee is \$155 for all three days.

LITURGICAL NOTES

Recently a posting on the Diocese of Orlando Deacons Facebook page launched a 'spirited discussion.' The question addressed was whether the deacons or the laity should assume the 'orans posture' when praying at mass. While academic discussions on topics such as this are always interesting, I would offer two observations. First, whenever we have these discussions they should always be from a position of charity and understanding, remembering that we are Christians and Deacons. Second, regardless of our personal opinions, our competent ecclesiastical authorities, to whom we made a vow of obedience, have made it clear that as ministers in liturgy **only the priest** should assume this posture during mass. Consistently the GIRM states that deacons are to pray or make invitations to the people "with hands joined." While our personal prayer styles may differ, this is a case where we need to remember that "we are servants to the liturgy, not its master." Thanks for your cooperation.

RECONCILING VETERANS RETREAT

We are excited to announce a new ministry opportunity for those willing to be a Spiritual Battle Buddy for a veteran longing to return to the sacramental life of the Church but who feels unworthy due to the spiritual wound of their military service.

There are many veterans who carry the physical and psychological wounds of their military service. For these wounds there are ample programs to assist them in managing their effects in their everyday lives. Yet there are other wounds many of us, as veterans, experience, the spiritual wounds. The deep regret we feel for orders carried out, liberties taken, and often the succumbing to the temptations of the seemingly encouraged military lifestyle.

The "Reconciling Veterans Retreat" encourages these spiritually wounded veterans that they are only one good confession away from experiencing God's unfathomable love for them, and that they can return to the sacramental life of the Church. The Spiritual Battle Buddy is a person who is willing to walk with these spiritually wounded veterans, by identifying a veteran who is seeking relief from their spiritual wounds, attending the retreat with them to encourage the veteran to deposit all the guilt into the loving hands of God through the sacrament of reconciliation, and celebrating with them the great community prayer of the Mass. We then continue to walk with the veteran to encourage remaining connected to their Catholic communities.

The first Reconciling Veterans Retreat will be held Saturday, November 9th, from 0900 to 1530 at the San Pedro Spiritual Development Center, with the keynote speaker Bishop John Noonan.
