# POSTPONING OF THE DIACONAL ORDINATION

As mentioned in the last Director's Notes, we have postponed the scheduled June 13th Ordination of the fifteen men in Cohort 2020 until the Fall. Some of you recently saw that the St. Vincent de Paul Regional Seminary conducted their Ordination of Transitional Deacons via a socially distanced process, and you may have wondered why we did not do the same.

Ordinations are intended to be community celebrations of the dedication of men to ministry. They are a time of great joy in which the new deacon's family, parishioners, and entire diaconal community gather to celebrate. It was in this spirit that we made the decision, with Bishop Noonan, to temporarily delay this Ordination. We felt that 90 days was not too long a wait to hopefully embrace the fullness of the joy of this

## **COHORT 2026**

We continue to press forward with the selection of men for the new cohort. We've reviewed 31 applications and have selected 16 men to be interviewed in the second week of May. Please continue to pray for these men and their wives as they continue their path of discernment.

You may ask what will happen with the other applicants who were not invited for an interview. The Diaconate office has provided detailed feedback to each applicant and their pastor specifying the reason(s) they were not selected.

The good news is that the vast majority of these men may apply again. Many are in their early 40s, with potential, requiring further development and guidance to be possibly accepted into a future cohort.

As you work with these, or other men, to prepare for applying for formation in the future, here are some important guidelines for you to consider:

- 1. They should have a relationship with their pastor, beyond the normal greetings and pleasantries before and after Mass.
- 2. Demonstrate that they have embraced the threefold ministry of the Deacon (Word, Liturgy, and Charity), through a documented ministry record over several years, both within and outside the walls of their parish. We look for those who are already living the calling of the diaconal ministry in their lives.
- 3. Evidence that their perceived calling is affirmed by members of their community, especially priests, deacons, or other community leaders.
- 4. IMPORTANT: They must complete the application completely, truthfully, and in detail. Brief or one-word responses to questions requiring self-reflection do not present the applicants appropriately to the review team. Also, those who are reapplying should not simply cut and paste responses from previous applications. The team compares the application to previous applications submitted by an applicant to evaluate growth in the way they understand and can articulate their calling.

Thank you for working with the men in your community to help identify those who are called to the ministry of servant in our Church.
