GENERAL ANNOUNCEMENTS

OCTOBER 3RD ORDINATION & CONVOCATION

The Diaconate Ordination is locked in for October 3, 2020 beginning at 10:00 a.m. at the Basilica of the National Shrine of Mary, Queen of the Universe. Final decisions regarding restrictions on attendance will be based on the status of the pandemic and projections as of September 1st. Our prayer is that we can assemble as a community to support these 15 men, and, also, renew our commitment to the Bishop. Thank you to those who responded to the survey regarding the possibility of a luncheon for current deacons and their wives. We had 72 responses of which 50 stated a desire to attend the luncheon, with 2 additional 'maybes.' With this input and based on the status of the virus at the start of September, we will make a decision and communicate next steps.

DEACON ENDOWMENT FUND

In partnership with the Catholic Foundation of Central Florida, we have established a Diaconate Reserve Fund. This endowment has been established in recognition of the growing need for formation, ministry and life of the Permanent Diaconate in the Diocese of Orlando. Specifically, the fund is established to:

- Provide partial scholarships for deacon aspirants or candidates who cannot meet the financial obligations of their initial formation;
- Provide partial scholarships for deacons or the wife of a deacon in certifying courses as Spiritual Directors, Chaplains, Tribunal Advocates, or other specified certifications; and
- Support other formative programs initiated by the Office of the Permanent Diaconate that benefit the corporal and spiritual needs of the Diocese.

CARA ANNUAL SURVEY ON THE DIACONATE

WASHINGTON-The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' (USCCB) Committee on Clergy, Consecrated Life and Vocations has shared the results of the annual survey on the permanent diaconate. <u>A Portrait of the Permanent Diaconate: A Study for the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops 2019-2020</u>, was conducted by the Center for Applied Research in the Apostolate (CARA) and provides an illustration of the state of the permanent diaconate in the United States, including the number of those ordained and retired in the past year, percentages of those involved in various Church ministries, and other demographic information.

The survey provides an interesting snapshot of the diaconate as a whole in the United States. It is encouraging to note that the Diaconate in the Diocese of Orlando, the 9th largest program in the nation, is more ethnically diverse (36% vs 24% nationally are not Caucasian), and the men currently in formation represent an even higher level of diversity. While our Diocesan deacons are on average older than the national average due to the number of men who retire to Florida, the ages of our men currently in formation will continue to lower that average.

DIOCESE OF ORLANDO STATE OF THE DIACONATE REPORT 2020

We will be conducting a 2020 Diocese of Orlando Diaconate Ministerial Experience and Satisfaction Survey which will be used in generating the Diocese of Orlando State of the Diaconate Report 2020. The report will include local diaconate demographics, survey results, and analysis of your submitted annual Deacon Self-Assessments. If you have not turned in your annual documents please do so as they will help give a more complete picture of the work of our local diaconate service in Liturgy, Word, and Charity.

MULTI-CULTURAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE

Thank you to those who have expressed interest in joining this important advisory committee. Unfortunately, the mix of applicants has not yet reflected the diversity of cultures that we have represented in our Diaconate. This advisory group will only be fully effective if it reflects our ethnic and cultural diversity. Please prayerfully discern if God is calling you to represent a currently underrepresented viewpoint by volunteering. Committee membership is open to active and retired deacons, wives, widows, and men in formation. Those interested in being considered for this volunteer committee are asked to submit a one-page statement of interest, describing why they wish to serve and a brief description of key areas they would recommend the committee address.
